

How to Report Confirmation of Pregnancy Review of Prenatal CPT II Codes

Using Current Procedural Terminology Category II (CPT® II) codes to report confirmation of pregnancy and prenatal care is important. These codes provide valuable information about patients' health, enabling health care providers to track improvements, identify gaps or opportunities, and facilitate timely interventions for better health outcomes.

Advantages of Using CPT II Codes

- Describe clinical components, test results, and procedures that are part of evaluation and management services
- Help report performance measures, identify patients who need increased clinical oversight, and close care gaps
- Decrease the need for chart requests, reducing administrative work
- Help align patients with relevant health and wellbeing programs

CPT II Codes for Closing Prenatal Care Gaps (Confirmation of Pregnancy)

The table below lists the CPT II code used for closing prenatal care gaps. When used with the dates of service, the CPT II codes confirm that care gaps will be closed.

Prenatal and Postpartum Care (PPC) CPT II Codes and Descriptions	
CPT II Code	Description
0500F	Initial prenatal care visit (report at first prenatal encounter with health care professional providing obstetrical care. Also report the date of visit and, in a separate field, the date of the last menstrual period (LMP) (Prenatal).
