

Medicare Risk Adjustment Spring Kick Off for Medical Record Request

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) requires Medicare Advantage plans to submit detailed documentation for each member. CMS rules require certain diagnoses for plan members be documented per ICD-10-CM standards and supported with valid documentation in the patient's medical chart.

We will begin our spring campaign requesting **2021 encounter dates** starting in April. You may receive a request for medical records from us or one of our vendors¹. Our vendors include PopHealthCare, CIOX Health and ShareCare. Please submit requested medical records within 10 business days of receipt.
