

## Removal of Some Medications from Condition Care Rx Program

To continue to keep costs down for our members, we are making some changes to our Condition Care Rx (CCR) program. As a result, Prime Therapeutics is updating the drug list for CCR, and some brand diabetes medications will no longer be part of this program. You can see a list of the medications impacted below.

### What You Need to Know

The cost share for members with commercial plans for the brand diabetes medications listed below is changing. Florida Blue has notified impacted members.

Currently, these medications have waived or reduced deductibles and cost shares for members on IU65 plans – for individuals under 65. Members on group plans with the Health Savings Account Preventive or Value-Based Drug Preventive drug list also have reduced deductibles and cost shares.

Beginning **January 1, 2025 for group plans and April 1, 2025 for IU65 plans**, these medications will be covered at the applicable standard brand cost share; deductibles will apply. *This change is only for the drugs listed below and does not apply to insulin or diabetic testing supplies.*
