



GLP-1 Prior Authorization Requirement for Commercial Plans Effective April 1, 2025

We are sharing essential reminders and updates regarding the prior authorization process, policies, and medical criteria specific to Glucagon-like Peptide 1 (GLP-1) medications. Effective April 1, 2025, members with a Florida Blue commercial plan¹ currently on a prescribed GLP-1 therapy will be required to have a prior authorization on file from a provider. We ask that you share the following information with your Florida Blue patients as necessary.

What You Need to Know

Florida Blue commercial plans only cover GLP-1 drugs when prescribed for the treatment of type 2 diabetes. Florida Blue does not cover or approve prior authorization requests for *off-label* indications.

For commercial plans, please keep in mind the following GLP-1 prior authorization criteria:

- Providers are required to provide clinical documentation of type 2 diabetes diagnosis when submitting a request for approval.
- Providers must submit documentation indicating the patient has tried and failed metformin, other metformin combination drugs, or insulin to demonstrate medical necessity for GLP-1 approval.
- If a patient is **not a type 2 diabetic or does not have the clinical documentation necessary** to support your request, the authorization request will be denied.

What Florida Blue Covers for the GLP-1 Drug Class

Listed below are the preferred GLP-1 drugs covered by Florida Blue for **type 2 diabetes with clinical documentation for a diabetes diagnosis**.

- Mounjaro
- Ozempic
- Rybelsus
- Trulicity

What Florida Blue Does Not Cover for the GLP-1 Drug Class

Medications used for weight loss/management are excluded from coverage under Florida Blue's health insurance plans. Requesting an authorization for drugs like **Wegovy**, **Zepbound**, **Saxenda**, **or other medications for weight loss/management will result in denial and patients will have to pay out of pocket.** Avoiding these submissions will support greater efficiencies with the prior authorization process.

Note: Florida Blue offers a variety of <u>wellness programs</u> for no extra cost at local Florida Blue Centers and online. Programs include **nutrition**, **weight management**, **exercise**, **cholesterol**, **diabetes**, **heart health**, **stress management**, **and more**. Providers are encouraged to remind their Florida Blue patients of these valuable offerings.

Where to Submit a Prior Authorization Request

Prior authorizations for GLP-1 prescriptions ensures all necessary clinical criteria for coverage have been met. Prior authorizations requests should be sent to Prime Therapeutics for review via the following link: CoverMyMeds. Submitting a pharmacy prior authorization can be straightforward, but there are several factors to consider.

- Submit a Prior Authorization Request One Time Only and be sure to include all the required information with your prior authorization request. A request completed correctly will be reviewed and processed quickly, within regulatory timelines. Submitting multiple requests with the same information delays the process.
- Response Time Is Key: If Prime Therapeutics reaches out for additional information, please respond as soon as possible. If you submit urgent pharmacy requests, you have 48 hours to respond to inquiries. Otherwise, the decision will be based on available information and could result in an unnecessary denial.

How You Can Help
